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| Notes | <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. In order to achieve the graduation threshold of the department, student must complete 128 credits, of which 58 credits from required courses, 2 credits from labor service, 2 credits from volunteer service, 22 credits from core optional courses, and 28 credits from general education courses. 16 credits are free optional courses accepted for taking any courses from all departments.</li> <li>2. All general education courses must follow the policies of General Education Center. Students must complete the required credit standards of Kainan University.</li> <li>3. The class is divided into class A and class B. Students are not allowed to change the class by yourselves. If you want to change, you must apply for it, and it can only be done after the approval of the department.</li> <li>4. Students must complete 'Study Passport' to fulfill the requirement for graduation.</li> <li>5. Students need to pass the intermediate level of GEPT, TOEIC650, IELTS4.0, TOEFL-IBT47 or above, or other equivalent European common language test to meet the graduation requirement.</li> <li>6. If the student has taken but failed to pass the intermediate level equivalent of GEPT before the senior year, or the TOEIC650, IELTS4.0, TOEFL-IBT47 or above, or other English test equivalent to the same level of the Common European Framework of Languages (CEFR) B1, Only can follow the "Key Points for the Implementation of Remedial Measures for the English Graduation Requirement of the Department of Applied English Studies"</li> <li>7. Freshmen should take the English placement test when entering the school, which will be the basis for the classification of the basic English courses for the first year.</li> <li>8. The graduation credits of F.5 Education System students are required to increase at least 12 credits.</li> <li>9. Taking "Graduation Paper Internship Program I" "Graduation Paper Internship Program II" can choose writing the thesis or off-campus intership</li> <li>10. These courses regulations were passed at the Curriculum Committee Meeting on May 19th. 2020, and approved for future references by Academics Affairs Meeting on May 19th, 2020.</li> </ol> |

- 【Alternate Courses】 English Translation, English Interpretation, English Fashion, English Story Telling, Introduction to English Grammar, International English Etiquette, English Drama.
- Major elective courses are divided into "English Language Teaching Section" and "English Business Application Section". Students who complete 8 courses (16 credits) in either section will be considered majoring in that section. If you complete 6 courses (12 credits) in one of the sections, you will be considered as minoring in that module. The "Professional Major Certificate" or "Professional Minor Certificate" of the relevant section will be issued upon graduation.
