In order to achieve the graduation threshold of the department, student must complete 128 credits, of which 58 credits from required courses, 26 credits from core optional courses, and 28 credits from general education courses. 16 credits are free optional courses accepted for taking any courses from all departments.

3. The class is divided into class A and class B.
