	Military	Military elective 1 credit, at most one course can be taken, and it can be counted towards general education free elective credits. If more than one course is taken, it will only be used to offset military service period and will not be included in graduation credits.
	Physical Education	1. The required physical education courses are 2 credits, with each course worth 1 credit and 2 class hours. A total of 2 courses (PE I & PE II). 2. The elective physical education course (Leisure Sports) allows a maximum of 1 course to be taken (2 credits, which can be counted towards general education free elective credits).
General Education Free Electives 4-8 Credits (Restricted to General Education Courses) *Note 2		

Note 1: Courses that are excluded from general education, as determined by each department, will not be counted towards graduation credits.

Note 2: The foreign language courses are as follows:

1. Students from the Department of Applied English and exception students can only take a second foreign language course other than the "required English" course, such as Japanese, Thai, Vietnamese, Korean, etc., for 4 credits (6 credits in language expression and 8 credits in general education free electives).
2. If a department plans a 4-credit professional English course for students above the second year, foreign language courses will only require 4 credits of first-year required English (6 credits in language expression and 8 credits in general education free electives).
3. Students from other departments must take 8 credits of "required English" courses (10 credits in language expression and 4 credits in general education free electives).

Note 3: The science perception field courses are as follows:

1. Students from the Department of Information Management must take 4 credits from any course in the science perception field.
2. Students from other departments must take 2 credits in "programming courses" and 2 credits from any course in the science perception field.

Professional Electives (Minimum 22 credits)

1. Students must complete in total of 128 credits for graduation, of which 60 credits should be from required courses, 2 credits from labor service, 2 credits from volunteer service, 22 credits from core optional courses, and 28 credits from general education courses. 14 credits are free optional courses accepted for taking any courses from all departments
2. All general education courses must be regulated by the policies of General Education Center. Students must complete the required credit standards of Kainan University.
3. The class is divided into class A and class B. Students are not allowed to change the class by yourselves. If you want to change, you must apply for it, and it can only be done after the approval of the department.
4. Students must complete 'Study Passport' to fulfill the requirement for graduation.
5. Students need to pass the intermediate level of GEPT, TOEIC650, IELTS4.0, TOEFL-IBT47 or above, or other equivalent European common language test to meet the graduation requirement.
6. If the student has taken but failed to pass the intermediate level equivalent of GEPT before the senior year, or the TOEIC650, IELTS4.0, TOEFL-IBT47 or above, or other English test equivalent to the same level of the Common European Framework of Languages (CEFR) B1, Only can follow the "Key Points for the Implementation of Remedial Measures for the English Graduation Requirement of the Department of Applied English Studies"
7. Freshmen should take the English placement test when entering the school, which will be the basis for the classification of the basic English courses for the first year.
8. The graduation credits of F.5 Education System students are required to increase at least 12 credits.
9. Taking "Graduation Paper Internship Program I" "Graduation Paper Internship Program II" can choose writing the thesis or off-campus internship
10. In accordance with the regulations of KNU interdisciplinary learning, students of this very department are required to take interdisciplinary program, double minor, or double major, in order to fulfill graduation threshold.
11. The aforementioned curriculum regulations were approved by the Curriculum Committee of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences on **1st May 2024**.
12. These courses regulations were passed at the Curriculum Committee Meeting on **14th May 2024**, and approved for future references by Academics Affairs Meeting on **14th May 2024**.
